AGED CARE BETTER PRACTICE AWARD WINNERS ANNOUNCED

Winners of the 2018 Better Practice Awards were honoured last night at the Australian Aged Care Quality Agency's *Better Practice for the Future* national conference dinner in Sydney.

Award nominees from across Australia gathered amongst sector peers to have their commitment to enriching aged care recognised.

Quality Agency CEO, Mr Nick Ryan, joined by the chair of the Aged Care Quality Advisory Council, Ms Andrea Coote, presented three organisations with National Innovation and Excellence in Aged Care Awards. In addition, seven Better Practice Commendation Awards were presented.
